- Relieve Ceiling Pressure: If you see a "bulge" or "bubble" in your drywall ceiling, it's filling with water. Take a screwdriver and poke a small hole in the center of the bulge. This will allow the water to drain in a controlled stream into your bucket, preventing the entire ceiling from collapsing.
